The referee reported that the Player made a tip/ spear tack at the hip then lifted her over her shoulder and released h neck first. The referee noted no mitigation and awarded a	ner resulting in the green player landing on her head/

Summary of player's evidence

The Player accepted that she had committed an act of foul play, which warranted a red card, and gave the following explanation for that foul play. She submitted that the act of foul play was not intentional and that

the tackle had very quick and much harder than she expected due to Bulgarian 13's speed in entering the tackle.

She said that she had positioned herself very low for the tackle with the intention that she would make a front on tackle. As she was very low, Bulgarian 13 ended up on her shoulder and the Player tried to hold her tight to avoid injury. The Player ended up off balance and Bulgarian 13 fell on the Player's right shoulder before making contact with the ground with her left shoulder.

Findings of fact

We are satisfied that the Player committed an act of foul play contrary to Law 19.18 which warranted a red card in that in the course of a tackle she lifted Bulgarian 13 off the ground and drove her such that her upper body made contact with the ground.

Whereas the referee viewed that the Player had released Bulgarian 13 who had landed on her neck/ shoulder, we are satisfied from reviewing the footage that there was no release but instead in bringing Bulgarian 13 down from the tackle, the Player drove her towards the ground with the consequence that her left shoulder made contact with the ground.

We accept the other elements of the referee's report.
