#### SUMMARY OF ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF CITING/REFEREE'S REPORT/INCIDENT FOOTAGE

Belgium player went to ground (slip) to collect the loose ball. Player no 14 of Czechia went to collect the ball/tackle the player and unintentionally made direct contact to the head of Belgian player with his shoulder.

### SUMMARY OF PLAYER'S EVIDENCE

CZE Player #14 confirmed incident was unintentional.

From a bad pass, the player tried to gain possession of the ball. Both player's competed for the ball with Belgian player getting there sooner and slipping in the process. CZE player #14 was already in motion and couldn't stop his movement. CZE Player #14 also showed regret and was happy the Belgian player wasn't injured.

#### **FINDINGS OF FACT**

Video evidence confirms the above player statement. Loose ball was competed for by both players on a very wet pitch. Unfortunate and unintentional head contact was made.

#### Summary of reason for number of weeks deducted:

Player was sent off during a final match which was lost by his team. Player already showed self-disappointment during the match and sending off was initial punishment. Additionally the pitch was extremely wet on the day due to 2 big storms that impacted the whole tournament. It was also clear from the footage that the contact was unintentional and unavoidable.

Regulations allow to enter decision point from low range sanctions. Decision was discussed with Disciplinary Admin also. As contact was made with the head, sending off wasn't considered as sufficient therefore player will miss one match in next tournament.
