The Third Yellow card report regarding the match between Czech Republic and Belgium played on the 11-06-2023, stated «The n. 1 of Czech after the bell, throw the ball away.»»

Summary of player's evidence

The player accepted that there was foul play, and she and her manager explained that the first 2 Yellow cards were rugby incidents, that occurred because the player was inexperienced and normal situations that should not have occurred, but happen in a rugby game.

The third yellow card was due to the fact that the game was almost over, it was the 4th time that they meet, and they were in front in the game by 2 points, in the last few minutes of the game, and the player had a chance to score a try and close the game, and she made a basic error and a knock on, and was frustrated and angry with herself, the player did not have the intention of wasting time. The player is young and should have deal with that differently. She is also getting use to this pressure games and situations.

The player said that she was sorry for her actions and that she never intended to show any disrespect or waste time. She Knows that she made a mistake, and will not repeat that, and it was a case of not dealing well with her mistake, frustration.

The player stated that she was never shown a yellow card before, and that she is 19 years old. The Manager also informed that the Czech team still have 1 match in the present tournament.

Findings of fact

No preliminary points arose.

The Manager and the Player accepted that the Player was the player involved in the alleged foul play.

The manager and the player did accept that there was foul play.

They explained that the first 2 yellow cards were due to technical offenses, normal in a game, and that the last one was a consequence of the young age of the player, the pressure that she felt, and the frustration of the error she made.

The player was very polite and show remorse for her actions, and also knew that her behaviour was not correct and had consequences for herself and her team.

The manager stated that the player did not have a previous disciplinary record.

The player behaviour was unblemished in the hearing and previous to that, and she showed remorse for her actions.
