SUMMARY OF ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF CITING/REFEREE'S REPORT/INCIDENT FOOTAGE

The player, Florin Antonio Petrescu, was cited by Citing Commissioner, Richard McGhee for a breach of regulation 9.18. The tackled player, Germany 23 takes the ball into contact and jumps off his feet as he prepares to pass the ball. Romania 11 makes the tackle as Germany 23 passes the ball. At this point Germany 23 is not beyond the horizontal but as the tackler stands up G23 is tipped beyond the horizontal. At this point the tackler could still release G23 or bring him down safely, but he continues to stand up, lifting G23 into an almost vertical position and then flips him over. G23 falls directly down onto his head from the vertical, despite breaking his fall with his arms. The tackler made no effort to bring the player to ground safely.

The referee issued a yellow card for the incident, but due to the lift, the drop, the fact that the player landed on his head, the lack of any attempt to bring the player down safely and the highly dangerous nature of the tackle this merited a red card. The Player was accordingly cited.

ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF OTHER EVIDENCE (e.g. medical reports)

There were two separate video clips of the incident and the German player was not injured and played on.

SUMMARY OF PLAYER'S EVIDENCE

The player accepted the red card without condition. He accepted that he had been reckless in the manner in which he had brought the German Player to the ground and that the German player landed on his head. The player asked the committee to note that the German player was off his feet making it somewhat more likely that he would flip. easier for the He noted that he shook hands with the player afterwards and that all was well.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The tackle was reckless and warranted a red card. The German player suffered no injuries and was able to play on. The Romanian player was entitled to full mitigation.
