SUMMARY OF ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF CITING/REFEREE'S REPORT/INCIDENT FOOTAGE

- The referee's report stated that:
- 1 Min, into the game, Ireland were attacking inside the Italy 22m line 7m from the touch. The ball carrier IRL #7 entered contact with a high leading elbow. There was separation from the body and the elbow/forearm made direct contact with the throat of the tackler. There was no mitigation so I issued IRL #7 with a RC.
 - The video images show clearly the incident.

SUMMARY OF PLAYER'S EVIDENCE

The player stated that he was carrying at speed into contact between two defenders, the inside defender didn't drop his body height and as he tried to fend the Italian on his far shoulder, The Italian defender connected with his forearm at the bottom of the italian throat. This was in no way intentional and he apologized immediately to the Italian player and after the game also.

The Italian player said he was 'fine' and he didn't receive any medical attention on the field of play.

FINDINGS OF FACT

No preliminary points arose.

The Player accepted that he was the Player involved in the alleged foul play.

The standard of proof for all matters under this Regulation 17 shall be on the balance of probabilities.

At first instance disciplinary hearings, in the event that the Player does not accept that the act(s) of Foul Play which is the subject of the disciplinary hearing warranted the Player being Ordered Off or cited, the burden of proof rests on the Player to show that the referee/citing commissioner was wrong.

There was little dispute as to the facts as displayed in the video recording and as described by the Referee's Report, except that the player wanted to make sure that the contact was not with his elbow, but with his forearm with the throat of the Italian Player.

The video images confirmed that the contact was between the throat of the Italian player and the forearm of the Irish n#7.

In any event it was submitted that the player accepted that there was a foul play, and that it was worth a red card.

Therefore, the Judicial Officer was required to consider what further action should be taken as a result of the player being shown a Red Card by the referee in respect of a contravention of law 9.12. The Judicial Officer found, on the balance of probabilities, that the Irish n#7 striked the Italian player throat with his forearm.

The images of the incident were clear and show the whole incident.

The player accepted that there was foul play which merited a red card, and therefore the Red Card decision was upheld.

Any act of foul play which result in contact with the head and/or the neck shall result in at least a mid-range sanction.

There was no evidence that the player wanted to strike the throat of the Italian player with his forearm intentionally. This action was reckless and it carried the very clear risk that there would be a dangerously contact between the forearm of the Irish player and the throat of the Italian player, as relation to the risk of injury and in relation to potential to cause injury.
